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#### **What is this product?**

##### **Type**

The Fund is a unit-linked insurance fund operated by Invesco Pensions Limited ("IPL"). Investments can be made via a Trustee Investment Plan, a unit-linked life insurance policy issued by IPL to eligible UK registered pension schemes.

##### **Objectives**

- The objective of the Fund is to achieve capital growth.
- The Fund invests in the Invesco Balanced Risk 8 Fund (UK), a fund managed by Invesco (the "Underlying Fund").
- The Underlying Fund aims to target 8% average volatility (a measure of the variation of the Fund's price over time) over a full market cycle (the time period where the market experiences a full range of economic outcomes). There is no guarantee that the Underlying Fund will achieve its target and an investor may not get back the amount invested.
- The Underlying Fund invests in derivatives (contracts whose value is linked to the value of an underlying investment) and other financially linked instruments to gain exposure to fixed income, shares of companies and commodities worldwide, although some investments may be made directly.
- Total economic exposure can be up to 3 times the value of the Underlying Fund by the use of leverage.
- The Underlying Fund is actively managed within its objectives and is not constrained by a benchmark.
- The return of the Fund corresponds directly to the return of the Underlying Fund, which in turn will depend on the value of the assets it invests in and the income they generate.
- You must make an initial minimum investment of £10m. Where we agree to accept them, you can make additional investments of at least £10,000.

##### **Intended Retail Investor**

The Fund is intended for trustees of UK Registered Pension Schemes aiming for long term capital growth, who may not have specific financial expertise but are able to make an informed investment decision based on this document and the Key Features Document, have a risk appetite consistent with the risk indicator displayed below and understand that there is no capital guarantee or protection (100% of capital is at risk).

##### **Term**

The Fund does not have a maturity date and may only be closed unilaterally in accordance with the terms of the contract between you and Invesco Pensions Limited.

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets.

We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-low risk level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact the product's performance.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment. However, you may benefit from a consumer protection scheme (see the section "what happens if we are unable to pay you"). The indicator shown does not consider this protection.

The product makes significant use of derivatives for investment purposes, which may result in the product being significantly leveraged and may result in large fluctuations in the value of the product.

The product is exposed to commodities which are generally considered to be high risk investments and may result in large fluctuations in the value of the product.

### What are the costs?
